HELP BUILD A HOME FOR BRENT

Army Sergeant Brent Hernandez was severely injured in Afghanistan when his aircraft, an Air Force CV-22 Osprey tilt-rotor, crashed. The aircraft caught fire and its wings broke off. The pilot, flight engineer, an Army Ranger, and a civilian contract employee were killed, and 16 were wounded. Hernandez was left unconscious and suspended by his safety line. His sniper partner cut him down and carried him approximately 100 meters away from the aircraft where he received medical attention while awaiting the medevac. Hernandez had his intestines ripped through his abdominal wall, two traumatic hernias, oblique muscles ripped in half and separated from spine, three fractured ribs, a collapsed lung, two fractured vertebrae, TBI and PTSD.
