Army Sergeant First Class Troy Reilly joined the military in October in 1987 in New Orleans, Louisiana. His injuries didn't occur in one specific incident, but rather throughout his deployment to Afghanistan. From the day his unit arrived, they took on sniper fire and were in close proximity to mortar and RPG attacks. During helicopter flights from FOB Shank to Bagram, the unit took on enemy fire from the mountain tops. While Reilly's unit served at Camp Blackjack, mortars and RPGs caused heavy damage.

Reilly, who spent nearly 20 years in the military, suffers from PTSD, recurrent major depression, panic disorder, vitigilo, lumbar and bilateral sacroiliac degenerative joint disease, tinnitus, and sinusitis. He has an 80% disability rating.

SFC Reilly received the Bronze Star Medal, Afghanistan Campaign Medal W/Campaign Star, Armed Forces Reserve Medal w/ 20-Year Device Silver, Army Commendation Medal (5th award), Army Achievement Medal (5th award), Meritorious Unit Commendation, Army Good Conduct Medal, National Defense Service Medal (2nd award), Global War on Terrorism Expeditionary Medal, Global War On Terrorism Service Medal, Non-Commissioned Officer Professional Development Ribbon, Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon (2nd award), and the CArmy Forces Reserve Medal w/M Device.

SFC Reilly has four children. He would like to reside in Louisiana.

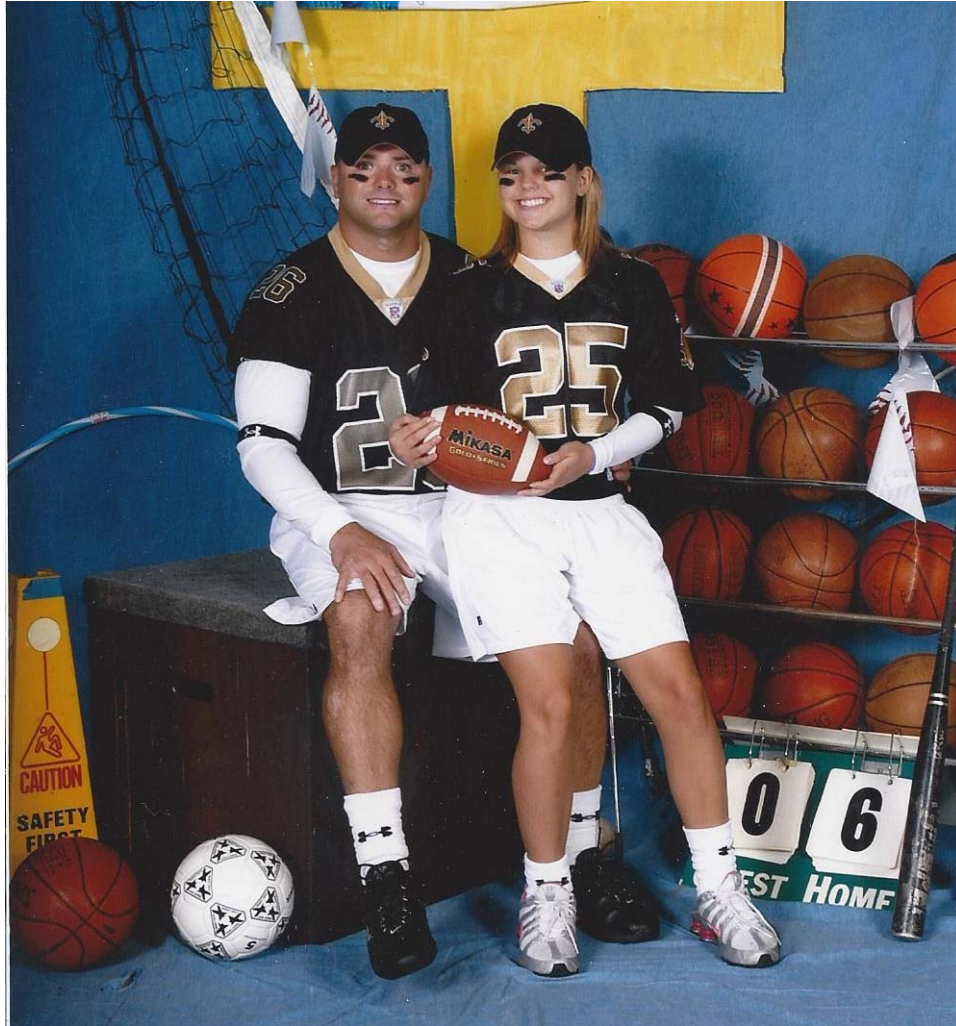
